CASS Icebreaker



Food Review: Mooncake



It is getting more rainy and chilly in Vancouver as you notice. You may also notice that the moon is getting rounder and rounder. This tells you our Mid-Autumn Festival is arriving. It is the time for friends and family gathering - enjoying the big dinner, moon watching, playing lantern and sharing the mooncake together. That is why everyone is rushing to buy mooncakes. Have you tried the mooncake yet?

The white lotus seed paste mooncake with the whole egg yolk and gold foil from Super Star Mooncake allows you to try the traditional style of mooncake. Having the combination of the salty egg yolk with the sweet white

lotus provides you a sense of satisfaction. When you try a small bite of the mooncake, you will first feel the sweetness of it, but the over sweetness may make you feel dull. Right at that moment, the savoury egg yolk creates an alternative taste which makes you immediately overwhelmed by a sense of warmth and happiness.

If you are still not yet a friend of the traditional mooncake, feel free to try the Snowy Mooncake from Maxim's instead. The outside of it is covered with unbaked glutinous rice powder having fillings inside. There are various favours of filling you can select from, including custard, chocolate, grapefruit with mango, mocha, tiramisu, chestnut, etc. Snowy Mooncake will melt in your mouth in just a few seconds and it is less heavy compared with the traditional mooncake.

Just a friendly reminder: while you are enjoying mooncake, you should prepare a pot of hot Chinese tea as it is the best match for mooncake. Enjoy the Mid-Autumn Festival with your family and friends and a taste of the traditional food – mooncake! Don't miss this great festival!
